From the CCOMM's desk...

Dear friends and supporters

We write with a heavy heart as we see the toll COVID 19 is taking upon our communities and families. But we are proud to see our Defence Force arriving in force to assist police in border control in NSW, QLD & SA. As with Op Bushfire Assist, our men and women in uniform have again come to the rescue.

It is for this among many other reasons that Everyman's strives to support them continually. On the border near EWS National HQ, our team has sacrificially gone out in extremely chilly conditions before dawn with the Brew Truck. That's because we know our ADF members are out there in the freezing cold, far away from home. Everyman's knows what it means to them, to have the Brew Truck pull up out of nowhere, with not only the "hot brew," but also the friendly smiling face and someone they know will listen. We know what it means for them, and the police, to be able to have the specially prepared, home-made "Mrs Matthews ANZAC bikkie". These are always a treat wherever we go and are a touch of motherly care. It has been great to see our Everywomen's Reps, ACOMM Lou Hochwimmer and REP Chris Kemper going out with the Brew Truck. Chris's husband SNR REP Kristian, has also continued to spearhead new areas of support along the border serving at the coldest hours of the pre-dawn mornings and the very cold days of the border's winter.

BRIG Mick Garroway, overseeing the operation, was very appreciative as we offered our assistance, and made sure our REPS' support could be streamlined. On one occasion our Brew Truck pulled up some troops just out of Kapooka, were so excited that they "mobbed the truck like seagulls," only to have their Commanding Officer sternly remind them of social distancing. Simple care and resources are a great encouragement to Defence personnel. They are deployed far from home and concerned for their families.

Our Queensland team has used this COVID time to make any repairs needed to their Brew Trucks, and are now on standby for the return of exercises. They have been requested out on small trips recently. We are also working hard to make our newly refurbished Rec Centre at RAAF Amberley well known to all, with good publicity, on this our largest base. The team at Kapooka has had no rest with recruit training continuing throughout the COVID restrictions.

But we have seen a slump in donations due in a large part because we have not been able to see Defence members nearly as much. A grant we put in for a new Brew Truck was declined this year, which of course means we must continue to economically stretch out the use of older vehicles.

There is no escaping, for any of us, the way COVID19 has impacted our world this year. In fact, 2020 has been one crazy year with bushfires, floods and then a novel coronavirus (and all this in just the first quarter)!

At the time of writing, every state in Australia has closed its border to Victoria. Everyman's HQ is situated at the Army Logistic Training Centre (ALTC), Gaza Ridge Barracks, BANDIANA, on the edge of WODONGA, VIC. The City of ALBURY is just across the border in NSW. The NSW Police with

the assistance of ADF Personnel are manning the border crossings and ensuring that everyone arriving at the checkpoint has a valid pass. This cannot be an easy task when the rules have continued to change through the weeks the border has been closed and the frustration of some trying to cross is evident.

I cannot pretend we are happy to have our lives interrupted in this way, but at the same time, we are thankful for the opportunities God has given us in the midst of this mayhem. SNR REP Kristian Kemper, REP Chris Kemper and I have been out in the Brew Truck taking a hot brew (cuppa) to both police and the ADF at various times of the day and night. The delight of the ADF Personnel when they see the truck arriving at dawn, or in the middle of the night, makes the 4am, or 11pm start worthwhile!

At the crossings around Albury Wodonga, many of the ADF personnel had just completed their basic training at Kapooka and were waiting for their courses to start at ALTC when they were called upon to assist with border control. Their delighted response to the Brew Truck is directly related to their interaction with REPs Warren Clarke and Milton Wilson at Kapooka. Many of them recalled the morale boost they received when the truck appeared at the toughest part of an exercise; just when they thought they couldn't put another foot forward!

Further downstream, were personnel from 8/9 RAR, Enoggera QLD. Having travelled down from Brisbane to our cold winter, they were very surprised to see the Brew Truck turn up out at the Yarrawonga Mulwala crossing. Once again, their response stemmed from their connection with Everyman's REP Ben Ridley, who deploys regularly with them on exercise, including some weeks in East Gippsland, VIC where 8/9 helped with the post fire clean up earlier this year.

It didn't take long for the police to also recognize the truck and greet us with waves and smiles, and line up for a hot brew. Many of the police have come down from Sydney, and on some of the smaller crossings, they are working without ADF Personnel. They tell us they are being well looked after by the locals passing through, with cups of hot coffee, pies, donuts and firewood being dropped off at regular intervals. One was overheard to say he thought the cold weather was shrinking his uniform!!

We have heard many positive comments from countless people who have passed through the border checkpoints, saying how nice everyone has been to them; and we have witnessed first hand how helpful they have been when people didn't have the right paperwork. They are all doing a sterling job, with a smile on their faces; courteous at all times and now being recognized by locals who need to pass through each day!

In all of this we have been blessed to be able to get the Brew Truck out to the border crossings and share the love over a hot brew.
