

## Kings Beach role in WW2 to be remembered

The significance of the Kings Beach area during World War Two will be commemorated with the unveiling of three statues and other events on 13 August.

"The statues will represent soldiers who paraded at Kings Beach Parade ground before heading north to stop the Japanese invading Australia," Gary Phillips from Caloundra RSL sub-branch said

"The military tradition is that those that paraded on the hallowed ground who die in combat, their spirit returns to that parade ground to wait for his mates.

"The bronze of the nurse and the stretchered soldier is in recognition of the nurses devotion to their patients, they see the carnage and battle damage.

"Along with the stretcher bearers first, the doctors and nurses second treat the body then the nurses treat both the body and the mind. This statue portrays that emotion

"What's more the model of the nurses statue is alive and lives in Caloundra, she will be 104 year on the day and she will be marching with the military band," Mr Phillips said.

"The military are fully behind this



with helicopters, ambulances, artillery pieces, military Band, soldiers marching and heads of corps flying in from Canberra."

Mr Phillips said that night at the Caloundra Civic Centre there will be a re-enactment of the Victory in the Pacific ball that took place in Caloundra. The 1st Regiment band will be playing all the swing music, Pacific Belles tribute band for the Andrew Sisters will be singing and the Kawana State College drama group will perform. The ball is sold out.

A military display will include items from the Queensland Air Museum and RSL sub-branch Museum.

Another significant military event will be held at Caloundra on October

14-16: An "inaugural" Australian Military History Spectacular presented by the Military Historical Society of Australia Queensland Division at the Caloundra RSL.

It will run over three days focusing on changes to defence since Vietnam.

On the weekend of 9-10 July, the Queensland Air Museum at Caloundra has its Open Cockpit Weekend.

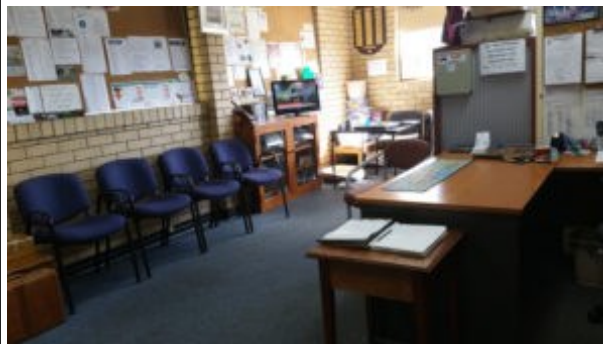

# Veterans counted in Census for first time

The 2021 Australian Census will help deliver better services for war veterans, according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

For the first time, the 2021 Census asked about current and former service in the Australian Defence Force. "This new data will assist in the development of policy and planning, including determining the most beneficial locations across Australia to offer services to veterans," the bureau says.

"The 2021 Census found more than half a million Australians (581,139) have served, or are currently serving, in the ADF – 84,865 current serving members and 496,276 former serving members.

"Less than one in seven (13.4 per



cent) of Australia's former serving members are female, although the proportion is a bit higher at over one in five (20.6 per cent) for current serving members."

Australian Statistician Dr David

Gruen said: "The ADF data in the 2021 Census will help the Department of Veterans' Affairs, Defence and community groups to provide the services needed by current and former serving members."

The Census data shows that more than one quarter of former serving members (26.1 per cent) are 65-74 years of age. This group of nearly 130,000 Australians (129,437) are mainly males (90 per cent) and represents the cohort resulting from the scheme of selective conscription in Australia under the National Service Act 1964. [They seem to be excluding Regulars and Nasho veterans above 74 since many of us up to are 77, given that National Service was introduced in 1975. – Editor]

The largest demographic group of current serving members are aged between 25-29 years (17.2 per cent).

One in twenty (5.3 per cent) of Australian households reported at least one person who has served or is serving in the ADF. With the largest Australian Army base, it is not surprising that Townsville (QLD) is the region with the highest number of current serving ADF members (5500) and forming serving members (8700).

## Where to now with veterans' funeral benefit issue?

Our main hope on addressing the anomaly that exists between the funeral benefit for older veterans and younger veterans seems to rest with the first budget of the new Federal Government in October.

Still, we have written to the new Minister for Veterans' Affairs and Defence Personnel Matt Keogh pointing out that in 2019 then Opposition Leader Bill Shorten had promised to increase the funeral benefit for older veterans – more than 84,000 at the time.

Older veterans covered under the Veterans Entitlement Act are entitled to a lesser amount for a funeral benefit than veterans covered under later legislation (up to \$2000 compared with up to \$10,000).

It would seem, justifiably, that the priority of the new government is to address the backlog of reportedly 37,000 claims from veterans to the Department of Veterans Affairs. The ongoing Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide is also apparently a priority.

Before the election, a response from DVA basically defending the status quo. We will wait and see. - **Editor**

## WINNER OF A.W.M. ART PRIZE

**WINNER** of this year's Australian War Memorial Napier Waller Art Prize is Anneke Jamieson, pictured with her winning portrait, *The Promotion*.

Anneke, a retired major and mother of three, took inspiration from her own experiences when creating the artwork which features an Army woman breast-feeding.

"I dedicate her to the mothers that serve; to their sacrifices and conflicted hearts and to the families who support them," Anneke said in her artist statement.

The prize is open to all current and former serving ADF members.

It is named after Mervyn Napier Waller, an Australian artist who enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force in August 1915.

In May 1917 he was wounded in the right arm and the arm was later amputated. During convalescence he learned to write and draw with his left hand.

In 1937 Waller was chosen to create the mosaics and stained glass windows in the AWM's Hall of Memory.

# Vietnam hero served with four air forces

A Royal Australian Air Force pilot who was killed in the Vietnam War had served previously in three air forces.

He was Flight Lieutenant 'Lofty' Lance (**right**) who was flying a Bushranger Huey with 9 Squadron when he lost his life on 7 June 1971.

He was providing gunship, ammunition resupply and casualty evacuation support for 3 RAR's

Bravo Company and Centurion tanks of the 1st Armoured Regiment, who were involved in an attack on a Vietnamese enemy bunker system in Long Khanh province as part of Operation Overlord.

During an ammunition resupply, his helicopter was hit by enemy fire and crashed into trees killing both himself and his gunner, David John Dubber. His co-pilot and one other crew member survived with minor injuries. A Casevac was attempted but had to be aborted due to intense enemy fire.

Everitt Murray 'Lofty' Lance was born in Western Cape,



South Africa on 29 April 1928. Lofty had served in Korea with the South African Air Force and with the Canadian and (British) Royal air forces before joining the RAAF.

In Korea he flew Mustangs and Sabres and became the 23rd South African to earn the American DFC (Distinguished Flying Cross) in Korea (out of a total of 55 South African pilots to receive

it) as well as the American Air Medal with Oak Leaf Clusters.

He joined the RCAF after the war in 1953, becoming an instructor, and the RAF in 1962. He met and married an Australian, so they later moved here where he joined the RAAF. He joined 9 Squadron in Vietnam on 19 November 1970.

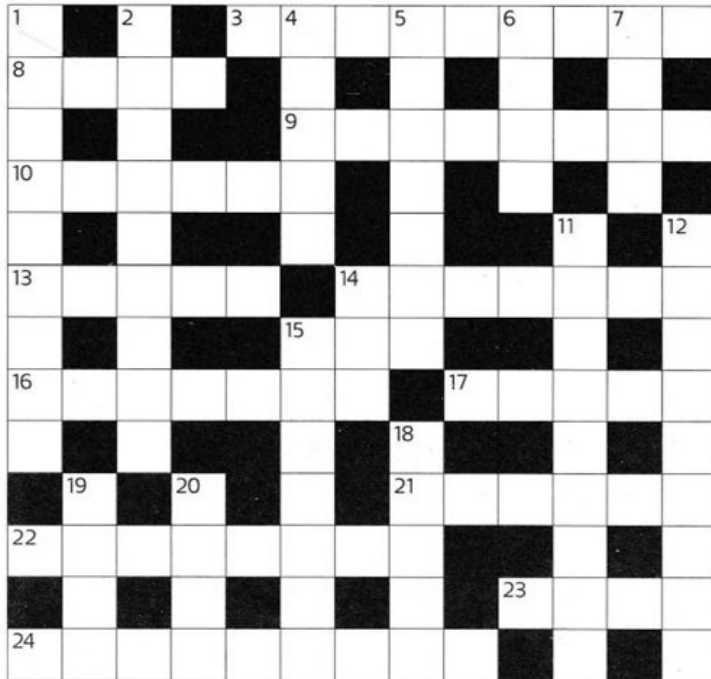

## DVA backlog review

Last year DVA commissioned an independent review of the compensation claims-processing system to assist in resolving the current backlog and improving the system for the future.

The review was undertaken in close consultation with DVA, ex-service organisations and other members of the veteran community.

Initiatives range from more support for veterans submitting claims to more help for medical providers supplying information. Some will require funding and/or legislative change.

The name referred to its radio call sign "Wallaby", rather than to the RAAF roundels on the aircraft, which featured a kangaroo painted in red. Wallaby airlines flew twin-engine DHC-4 Caribous and were active in Vietnam from 1964 to 1972. These soldiers were boarding for Saigon on their way home. — AWM photo.*



## July Timeline — Merinos to Korea

**1 July 1797:** The first merino sheep were landed in Australia. The first Australian-produced fleece was sold in England in 1807 and by the late 19th century, wool had become Australia's major export.

**1 July 1841:** New Zealand was separated from the Colony of New South Wales and made a colony in its own right. This ended more than 50 years of confusion over the relationship between the islands and the Australian colony. On **1 July 1851**, Victoria separated from NSW.

**2 July 1881:** United States President James A. Garfield was shot and mortally wounded as he entered a railway station in Washington, DC. He died on 19 September.

**3 July 1891:** After maritime and shearers' strikes, the largest, most violent industrial actions seen in Australia, activists realised that change for working people would only come about through combined union and political action. This led to the creation of the Australian Labor Party.

**3 July 1988:** Iran Air Flight 655 was destroyed while flying over the Persian Gulf after the US Navy warship Vincennes fired two surface-to-air missiles, killing all 290 passengers aboard. A subsequent US military inquiry cited stress-related human failure for the mistaken identification of the civilian airbus as an enemy F-14 fighter jet.



**6 July 1964:** Warrant Officer Class Two Kevin Conway, an Australian Army Training Team advisor, is killed in action, the first Australian battle casualty of the war.

**10 July 1991:** Boris Yeltsin took the oath of office, becoming the first popularly elected president in Russia's thousand-year history.

**20 July 1969:** At a United States Marine non-commissioned officer's club near Da Nang, a civilian pop entertainer, Cathy Wayne (**pictured**) becomes the first Australian woman killed during the Vietnam War. US Marine Sergeant J. W. Killen is found guilty of her murder, having shot her accidentally while attempting to kill his commanding officer.

**21 July 1969:** At 12.56pm (AEST) when the Apollo tracking station at Honeysuckle Creek, near Canberra, transmitted live television of Neil Armstrong stepping onto the surface of the moon to a worldwide audience of 600 million (a record for the time).

**27 July 1953:** The Korean War ended with the signing of an armistice by US and North Korean delegates at Panmunjom, Korea. The war had lasted just over three years.

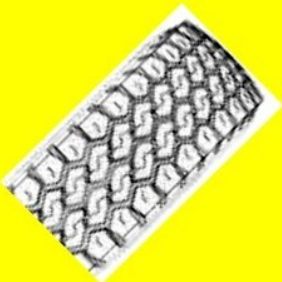
